The Hundred square and number patterns Use a hundred square you have at home or use this link to colour in numbers <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/paint-the-squares">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/paint-the-squares</a></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Ask your child to find various numbers on the H.Sq. Show me 72, 28, 33 etc.</li> <li>➤ Show me the number with 6 tens and 4 units/2 tens and 8 units</li> </ul>

- What number is directly above 53? / directly below 49?/to the right of/to the left of?
- Play Guess my Number – pick a number in your head. Your child has to ask questions you can only say yes or no to. We do this in school a lot so they're used to it. Eg Is ur number greater than/less than \_\_\_? Is your number odd/even? Is ur number in the 50's? etc. Take turns playing this.

## 2. Addition

- Adding units. Using concrete materials – cubes, lego etc make numbers using these. Tens are “towers” or ten cubes stuck together, units are left loose. Practice some of these eg;  $23 + 4$ .
- Maths book pgs 131, 132.
- Adding tens. Use the hundred square to count on in tens – moving up and down the rows.  $29 + 20$  – ensure your child can find 29 and counts on 2 tens by saying 39, 49.

## 3. Rounding

- Explain the concept of rounding to the nearest 10. Why we might use it – when we're out shopping trying to calculate the rough price of a few items/estimating crowds of people/estimating how many toys there are at a quick glance etc.
- Show on the number line, numbers ending with 5 and above round up to the nearest 10 and numbers ending in 4 or below round down – explain why this is – 23 is in between 20 and 30, it's closer to 20, that's why it rounds down.
- Pick numbers from the hundred square and ask your child does it round up or round down
- In school we learn the rhyme “5 or above give it a shove, 4 or below let it go”

## **Second Class**

### 1. Area

- Explain that surface area is the amount of space taken up by something. Choose a copy/book and playing cards/cubes/blocks for measuring. Estimation is very important. Ask the question – how many playing cards do you think are needed to cover the copy/book? Then measure. If “half or a bit” is needed, include it as one when counting.

Why?</li> <li>➤ Choose various items around the house to estimate and measure the surfaces of them using different things to measure, e.g. the kitchen table, a rug, a blanket etc</li> <li>➤ Cjfallon online tutorials and activities 149 - 151</li> <li>➤ Maths book Pgs 148 – 151</li> <li>➤ Shadow book pgs 50, 51</li> </ul> <p>2.
